

Definition of the marine boundary

as used by Member States for field 2.3 of the Standard Data Form

The SDF requires that the percentage of the marine area in a site has to be given. The definition of the coastline used to define the marine boundary should follow international (e.g. UN Convention on the Law of the Sea - UNCLOS) or national legislation. Each Member State shall therefore provide the description of the boundary used to the Commission.
